Doctor Samuel Milham is a pioneer in using the tools of epidemiology to study patterns of occupational disease and death.

His work combines clinical insight with state-of-the-art epidemiologic technique, the two balanced in a syncopated harmony of exquisite equilibrium.

Doctor Milham pioneered in use of the proportionate mortality ratio for study of occupational illness.

Through diligent application of this technique to many thousands of death certificates in the State of Washington, U.S.A., he documented hazards of nasal cancer in woodworkers, lymphoma in forestry workers, electrocution in agricultural workers, and leukaemia in workers exposed to electromagnetic fields.

Doctor Milham's studies have been corroborated by extensive epidemiologic research worldwide.

His research has pointed the way to prevention and has saved the lives of thousands.
