BERNARD GOLDSTEIN

as *Ramazzini Award* recipient and *Ramazzini Lecturer* for 2008.

Bernard Goldstein has devoted his career to facilitating the use of science as a means to improve environmental and occupational health policy nationally and globally.

Dr. Goldstein is Professor of Environmental and Occupational Health and the former Dean of the University of Pittsburgh's Graduate School of Public Health. He was the founding Director of the Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences Institute in New Jersey and was Director of its NIEHS Center of Excellence. He is a physician, board certified in Internal Medicine, Hematology and Toxicology. As a member of the US National Academies of Science Institute of Medicine he has chaired over a dozen committees evaluating issues central to environmental and occupational health. He is one of the early Fellows of the Collegium Ramazzini and is a Fellow of the American Society for Clinical Investigation.

Dr. Goldstein received the Robert A. Kehoe Award of Merit of the American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine, the Katherine Boucot Sturgis award from the American College of Preventive Medicine, the Distinguished Service Award from the American College of Toxicology, and the Distinguished Achievement Award from the Society for Risk Analysis. He served as president of the Society for Risk Analysis, vice president and current editor-in-chief of the Scientific Committee on Problems of the Environment. He is a member of the NIH National Advisory Environmental Health Sciences Council.

Beginning more than forty years ago in the United States Public Health Service Division of Air Pollution, Dr. Goldstein has made major contributions to understanding the health effects of toxins and is renowned for his research on benzene. In the great Ramazzini tradition, Dr. Goldstein is a defender of truth in science and his work has aided in the protection of workers, the general population and the natural environment worldwide.
